


Another day, another Liberal scandal unfolds

This procurement contract was never completed – with no accountability for the expenditure.

At issue is the 2020 Liberal/NDP deal with vaccine maker Medicago, partly owned by tobacco giant Philip Morris International. For clear reasons, international organizations refused to accept its vaccine for emergency use in 2022, because it was partly owned by a tobacco company.

Following this development, the company's majority owner Mitsubishi Chemical Group, announced it was shutting the company down in light of "significant changes" to the vaccine market three years into the pandemic. Not only has the \$150M disappeared, but \$170M in infrastructure costs paid to set up the vaccine delivery system is gone as well!

I have called for the Health Committee to require testimony from the Minister of Health, Minister of Industry and the Auditor General,

I will also seek answers as to why the wasted \$320M is hidden two-thirds into a four-inch thick 2023 Public Accounts Report. The Liberal/NDP coalition knew they were investing in a company that was doomed to fail.

Foodbanks prepare for Christmas meal needs

I rose in the House of Commons before the Christmas break to speak on Canada's food supply crisis that is smothering the poor, noting the Colchester Food Bank's regular assistance roster has risen dramatically to 1,800 people -- a staggering amount of clients considering the community's size. Across the country, two million people use food banks every month. Canadians are reaching out to all of our offices in record numbers about the fact that they can no longer make ends meet. The carbon tax, out-of-reach housing rental and mortgage costs have seen Canadians unable to feed themselves, house themselves and keep the heat running.

In speaking with Shelly DeViller, executive director of the Colchester Food Bank, preparing for the Christmas rush has been softened somewhat thanks to a recent food drive that realized \$74,740 and 17,742 pounds of food. Clearly, this reflects efficiencies of the local food bank, and at the same time we need to recognize that last year 613 Christmas dinner packages were supplied. This season, Shelly expects at least 700 orders, consisting of a turkey and all the trimmings, at a cost of approximately \$60 each, for a total of \$42,000.

The money doesn't go far, and the need for continued support is essential, enabling the Colchester Food Bank and the Amherst Food Bank to make it through the slow donation periods of January and February.

In Cumberland, the Amherst Food Assistance Network Association acts in conjunction with six area churches, providing Christmas Cheer to just under 400 families. That's about 20 per cent higher than 2022.

Executive Director Charlotte Ross tells me the churches have their individual plans, and the food bank supplements them with supplies delivered by Feed Nova Scotia.

I believe that the people of Cumberland-Colchester are extremely generous. We take care of each other. So, as the Holiday Season nears, I urge all constituents to reach out to support our food banks.

Especially during the Holiday Season, my family and I thank for your support. We are all in this together, working toward making Cumberland-Colchester a better place to live and prosper. I am honoured that you have placed your trust in me.

On November 21st, the Liberals tabled their Fall Economic Statement and Liberal Finance Minister Chrystia Freeland and the Prime Minister of Canada for removing the GST and HST from psychiatric services such as psychotherapists and mental health counselors.

The idea was in my Private Members Bill C-323 almost word-for-word, a piece of solid legislation that had received Second Reading in the House and is waiting for study by the Finance Committee.

I wrote in September, "According to Health Canada statistics, the services of a psychotherapist or a mental health counsellor are just as important to the health of Canadians and their families as those of a nurse or family doctor. Bill C-323 would remove the federal tax from those services to relieve some of the financial burden placed on them by the Liberal government."

Bill C-323 is an excellent piece of legislation, so good that the Liberals recognized a bill that they could reconstruct as its own, figuring no one would notice!

This is the way Trudeau and the Liberals work – by practicing plagiarism!
